#### Introduction:

Following the 2<sup>nd</sup> Global Summit of Research Institutes for Disaster Risk Reduction: Development of a Research Road Map for the Next Decade, the atmospheric and water related disaster and integrated disaster risk management groups agreed to establish a network of international research groups to investigate hydro-meteorological disasters in an effort to implement new research methodologies that emphasize transdisciplinary approaches.

The GADRI workshop entitled, "Round Table Discussion: Towards an Integrated Disaster Risk Research Platform for Hydro-meteorological hazards." The GADRI workshop will be held at the Disaster Prevention Research Institute (DPRI), Kyoto University, Uji Campus on 13 October 2015 followed by a wrap-up session on 16 October 2015.

The GADRI meeting aims to strengthen and increase its collaboration and exchange with other international researchers regarding hydro-meteorological hazards across different regions.
